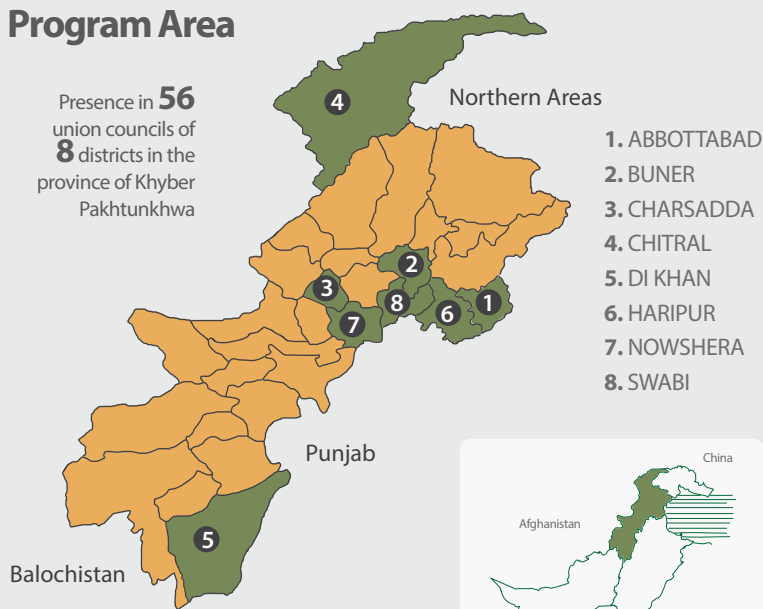


# Livelihood Support & Promotion of Small Community Infrastructure Program (LACIP)

## Introduction

LACIP is co-financed by the Federal Republic of Germany through KfW and implemented through PPAF. The program aims to contribute to the improvement of general living conditions, reduction in vulnerabilities to disasters, improvement in quality of life and to increase in income generating opportunities of the 600,000 poor beneficiaries in the selected program districts with particular focus on inclusion of women the destitute and disabled members of the communities. The project is carefully designed for economic uplift of the bottom poor who fall below poverty line by the provision of productive asset transfer demand based provision of community infrastructure meant to increase living standard and impart good governance.

## Objectives

The overall objective is the contribution to the improvement of general living conditions and quality of life of poor population in the project region.

- Increase access to and sustainable utilization of social & economic infrastructure by the population of the project region
- Increase employment and income opportunities, especially for the poor
- Strengthen local civil society and enhanced participation of the population in decision making at the local level

## Components



The program interventions are focused around five thematic areas, namely, Community Physical Infrastructure (CPI), Livelihood Enhancement & Protection (LEP), Health & Education (H&E) and Disaster Preparedness and Mitigation (DPM) with development and strengthening of community institution (ID) as the bedrock of all activities implemented by PPAF.

Under ID component 4,151 COs, 326 VOs and 38 LSO have been formed till June 2016. So far, 9,792 (6,996 male & 2,796 female) community and PO staff members were provided trainings to improve governance, linkages, record keeping and to ensure the overall sustainability of community institutions. The result of LACIP social mobilization activities can also be witnessed and gauged through the number of community institutions members elected as Local Body representatives in the local government election held across Pakistan. Particularly in the project area of LACIP on different seats 219 CIs members (including 204 men and 15 women) have been elected.

Funds amounting to EUR 13.77 million have been allocated for demand-driven infrastructure schemes. Following revised strategy, small scale projects were replaced with integrated large infrastructure projects, hence no new small schemes has been initiated in last two quarters. Against already ongoing 1,878 small CPI projects, 1831 schemes have been completed as of June 2016. Similarly, against target of 77 large projects, 58 were initiated and 17 have been completed as of June 2016. The majority of implemented projects are link roads and bridges that focus improving access along main routes and also help in building farm to the market linkages. The other major projects are sanitation and drinking water supply schemes that provide clean and healthy environment, improve the health of community and ease out the daily workout routine, especially of women. The other projects are of Irrigation types that increase the crop / fruit yield and productivity of cultivable command area. Overall, these projects have benefitted over a million persons belonging to eight districts of KP province.

Under Livelihood Enhancement & Protection component, a total of 7238 productive Assets (3,960 male + 3,278 female) have been transferred and under Technical & Vocational trainings 3,996 beneficiaries (2,769 male and 1,227 female) were equipped in the fields of electrician, plumbing, building electricians, steel fixer trades, tailoring, bed sheet making, and agriculture, livestock and enterprise development by LACIP POs in seven districts of KPK. As revised strategy 45 common interest groups were formed around the trading of livestock and collective businesses.

Health and Education component contributes in improving conditions of public schools and BHUs. The support includes construction of missing facilities such as toilets and additional classrooms, boundary walls, water tanks, repair and renovation, provision of laboratory equipment, library books and, sports kits and teachers' trainings on new teaching methods, lessons planning and school administration. By June 2016, 148 public schools and 4 BHUs were supported benefitting 30,885 students and above 50,000 OPD patients. In addition to this health financing was provided to 94 poor patients running the risk of spending out of pocket substantially on health expenditures.

Under DPM component, 3,748 Village Disaster Management Committees members (1116 women members) were provided community based disaster risk management – training program to build their capacity. Early warning trainings for school children and staff, health unit staff, local government staff was provided to 4,651 persons out of which 1,889 were women. Seven mock drill exercises were conducted in which 862 members from VDMCs participated. Overall 47 disaster kits were distributed to the VDMCs. 18 disaster mitigation structures (Flood Protection Walls, Causeway, Culverts and Check Dam) were constructed amounting Rs. 36.90 million that are expected to benefit 4,951 HHs.
